The Channel Islands Council (CIC) received a very unusual request for assistance from the Family Readiness Group of NMCB 5. The Group was trying to obtain numerous items needed by battalion members to sustain themselves during a fourteen-day isolation at Hueneme upon their return from an extensive deployment to the eastern pacific. This is a new requirement imposed on truly short notice, so no one was prepared for it. The items were needed in about two days from the time we learned of the need.

The CIC board was contacted and agreed that this was not in our budget, but the Seabees needed help and we should do what we could. Our only option was to ask the board members to donate what they could in cash, and we would get that to the FRG the next day to assist them in procuring the needed items.

Twelve of our members were able to donate and we provided a check for \$850.00 to the FRG on the next day.

The CIC is not organized to provide unplanned support, but this is an example of the dedication of our members to supporting our maritime services in unexpected situations whenever we can.
